### **REFUGEE FAMILY UPDATE**

The committee that is working to welcome our refugee family from Eritrea and to help them settle into their new lives in Canada would like to provide an update to St. Gerard's parishioners.

Our diocesan liaison informed us in early May that all members of the family are now officially eligible as refugees as per the definition of the Canadian Refugee and Humanitarian program. There will be a background check done on all of them, followed by a medical check. Once the medical checks are complete, they will be issued their visas and will arrive in Canada shortly thereafter. It is possible that they will arrive by the beginning of August.

We are very excited to meet the family soon!

We do need your help though. Our committee needs more volunteers; we need to have a solid core group to help plan and organize.

If you signed up to donate items, please get ready to bring the items in. To date approximately \$6,000 in household goods have been pledged. We have found a **house** for the family, but we will need volunteers to **help set it up** for them!

**Monetary donations are very welcome!** There are still some items we need, plus monthly services or rent to cover. So far, just over \$5,100 has been contributed to the Refugee Family Fund. Monetary donations may be placed in the weekly collection in an envelope marked "Refugee Family". We really appreciate your generosity!

Once the family arrives, we will need your **continued support**. They will need us to help them settle, which means making appointments for various things, transportation, shopping. They will also need a **support network**, people they can call on if they need anything, have questions or need a friendly face to help them with something. Everything will be new for them so having people they can count on to help them through all the newness is so important.

At the back, on the table in front of our display, you will find a sign-up sheet. If you feel called by the Spirit to help, please join the committee. ### Hang on to Hope When the World Is Falling Apart

It's easy for us to feel overwhelmed and helpless in the face of the many natural disasters, blatant injustices, and tragedies in our world. Are earthquakes, tsunamis, and droughts worse than in the past, or are we more aware of them due to modern communication? Injustices tear at our hearts the most since they are under human control. Terrorism, corrupt governments, oil spills, and pollution are mammoth problems of human making. Tragedies like death, divorce, or lingering illness can devastate us. We wonder: How can God allow such suffering when we try so valiantly to do what's right and pray so hard?

What's a Christian to do? Wallow in grief or guilt? Rail at God? Give up? Grieving is OK—for a time. Even getting angry at God is human. The psalms are good examples of people pouring out their grief and anger to God. (See Psalms 22, 55, 57, 88, 94, and 102 for a start.) Don't worry. God can handle our strong feelings.

There comes a time, however, when we have to pick ourselves up and carry on. The following actions have helped us when we've felt overwhelmed or powerless in the face of problems and evils in our world.

**Cultivate gratitude:** Let go of your anger through consciously noting one thing each day for which you're grateful.

**Pray in solidarity:** Of course we pray, both personally and at Mass, for people affected by natural disasters and tragedies of all kinds. Adding our bodies to our prayers through fasting or other sacrifices can build solidarity with the victims and reinforce our prayers.

**Take action:** Actions put feet on prayer. Can you take one action step in the direction of change? This won't solve the whole problem, but it gets you out of the starting gate.

### Take on only what you can handle:

When making even one step feels like too much, you might be right. Sometimes we're truly maxed out and have to trust others and God to take care of the current problem.

**Think bigger:** Those of us with just the ordinary demands on our time, energy, and money have the responsibility to think bigger. Consider that your strong emotion of anger or helplessness may be a call from God to act. You've been touched and moved.

**Make a friend:** Whatever problem is touching your heart, there are probably others who have organized a group that's already working on it. Besides, having others to work with is motivating and can refine bigger ideas.

### What's Faith Got to Do with It?

Jesus spent his life showing us how to deal with adversity and how to be neighbors. And what did it get him? Crucified! If we're following Jesus, we shouldn't expect comfort and ease; rather, we need to spend ourselves for others and learn to love better. Jim McGinnis, a modern-day prophet and cofounder of the Institute for Peace and Justice, wrote: "In the face of escalating violence, let us escalate love."

### For Your Reflection

God cherishes even the sparrows, who cannot fly without God's help. Yet sparrows are worth nothing compared with us.

- Is it easy or difficult to believe that you are cherished by God? How so?
- Is it easy or difficult to believe in yourself? Do you think you are significant? Why or why not?
- Do you think most people your age feel their worth from their friends' opinions of them or from their own opinions about themselves? Explain your answer.
- Who else cherishes you? Who believes in you? Who knows you are significant?

Jesus tells us to proclaim the truth from the rooftops. Jesus urges us to not be afraid of anyone who can only hurt our body, but to fear whatever can hurt our soul.

- What can hurt your soul? What influences from today's world can prevent you from being the best you can be? How do you counteract those influences?
- What things are you afraid to talk about because you may be teased or mocked? How often do you talk about your inner fears and concerns? How often do you talk about your biggest dreams for yourself and for the world? What is the most important focus of your life right now?

**RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)** is an incredible journey of discovery, the discovery of God's love in Jesus. If you or someone you know is interested in exploring the friendship and saving grace of Jesus Christ, we invite you to join us in the RCIA journey. It is a warm, welcoming experience that introduces the Christian faith in our Roman Catholic tradition. We explore topics such as Holy Scripture, the Sacraments, Church history and the core beliefs of the Church. Anyone who has taken this "leap of faith" has found it to be a life-altering experience.

The RCIA process is intended for those who are non-baptized. There are several rites and stages that are part of the process to prepare adults for Baptism and to receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil.

**Rite of Reception of Baptized Christians into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church.** If you have been baptized in another Christian tradition, the Catholic Church respects that baptism. Baptism is the sacrament of our rebirth in Christ and our immersion into His saving death and Resurrection. It can never be repeated. Reception into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church happens after a period of preparation through catechesis, prayer and worship, and an introduction to Catholic life, values, and mission.



Adults who have been baptized in the Catholic Church but have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation can prepare for reception of this sacrament through a period of catechesis and prayer.
