Archbishop's Appeal

In today's Gospel, Matthew's recount of the 10 virgins sits amidst numerous parables about the heavenly kingdom. In fact, all three of the readings today are end of time in nature. In the first reading, the writer personifies a heavenly wisdom, making note that this wisdom, which is clearly beyond this world, is readily available for those who prudently live their lives seeking it. That which is the only wisdom that satisfies "graciously appears" to those who "keep vigil." In the second reading, Paul addresses the Thessalonians about those who have died, assuring them that, through His death and resurrection, Christ has won the victory for us. Therefore, those who die in Christ will be raised. o, it is clear that the message of today's readings is one that is beyond this world. They communicate to us about life hereafter. The lesson here is this: if you are not prepared for the heavenly feast, you will be locked out forever! It is a sobering reminder of God's love and justice. We don't know when the Lord's return will take place or when we will be ushered from this world. So as Christians, stewards of God's manifold gifts, we must use all of our time, talents and treasure, every minute that passes, wisely. The Archbishop's Appeal provides us with the opportunity to invest wisely all of our gifts.
