

Jesus Expects More than the Minimum By Mary Katharine Deeley

Commonly in recent years, large corporations whose business practices are questioned have replied, "Everything we have done is legal." I have always been uncomfortable with that because it implies that those in charge will not do anything more than they have to in order to stay within the law. The minimum standard becomes the maximum standard. In our hearts and minds, though, we know that the common good is best served when people do more than they must. While doing the minimum required is everyone's job, we expect more of those who are in positions of leadership. We expect more of our best and brightest. And Jesus expects more of those who follow him.

The young man who comes to Jesus is both secure and comfortable in doing what is required. Jesus agrees that he has done the minimum. But the young man himself knew there was more he could do. His intelligence, curiosity, and deep reflection told him that obeying the law was not enough. When he persisted in his question, Jesus called him to more. In the same breath, Jesus challenges all of us to find what more we can do. We might obey the Ten Commandments, attend Mass every Sunday, and not offend anyone. But do we: care for those who have less, support the Church, and follow Jesus even when it's difficult? Are we willing to sacrifice our possessions and our lives, if necessary, for His sake? Is there more you can do today to reflect Christ to the world?

#### YOUTH REFLECTION

#### "Jesus and the Rich Young Man"

#### This Week...

In the first reading, Solomon tells us how one can give up all riches and material wealth in order to seek Wisdom, yet find riches beyond imagination because of seeking Wisdom above all else. In the Gospel Jesus tells how one must give up all riches in order to follow him and find the Reign of God in heaven, which of course will be far more glorious than all the possessions that have been given up. How can we give up things? Why must we give up things? The second reading gives the answer: It is the almighty and powerful way of God.

#### For Your Reflection

Jesus gives us some harsh words: If you are rich, don't count on getting into the Reign of God. Don't count on entering heaven. Don't count on receiving all the wealth and riches you are looking for.

- Are most teenagers you know more interested in making good money or in doing good things for the world? What are you most interested in?

- Do you believe that money can buy happiness? Do you think most teenagers would agree with you? Why or why not? What does society's behaviour indicate?

We don't hear the name of this rich young man. The Gospel doesn't tell us that he went away, never to return to Jesus again. We don't know if he ever did sell his possessions and give the money to the poor, or if he ever came back to follow Jesus.

- What do you think happened to him?

- If you were telling this story, how would you write the ending? What would happen to this rich young man, and how would he spend the rest of his life?

**RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)** is an incredible journey of discovery, the discovery of God's love in Jesus. If you or someone you know is interested in exploring the friendship and saving grace of Jesus Christ, we invite you to join us in the RCIA journey. It is a warm, welcoming experience that introduces the Christian faith in our Roman Catholic tradition. We explore topics such as Holy Scripture, the Sacraments, Church history and the core beliefs of the Church. Anyone who has taken this "leap of faith" has found it to be a life-altering experience.

The RCIA process is intended for those who are non-baptized. There are several rites and stages that are part of the process to prepare adults for Baptism and to receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil.

**Rite of Reception of Baptized Christians into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church.** If you have been baptized in another Christian tradition, the Catholic Church respects that baptism. Baptism is the sacrament of our rebirth in Christ and our immersion into His saving death and Resurrection. It can never be repeated. Reception into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church happens after a period of preparation through catechesis, prayer and worship, and an introduction to Catholic life, values, and mission.



Adults who have been baptized in the Catholic Church but have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation can prepare for reception of this sacrament through a period of catechesis and prayer.
