### Jesus Valued Marriage Highly

My mother was convinced that none of her children would get married. We were older when we were called to that vocation but, one by one, we did marry. I'm happy to say that my husband and I continue to share this vocation three decades later, and we give our thanks to God. My sister was not as fortunate. After years of abuse, she divorced her husband. She didn't make that decision lightly. She went into counseling, prayed, and talked. She considered her children, her husband, and herself. And she read and reread today's Gospel from Mark. In the end, safety for herself and her children was a major concern.

Jesus railed against the ease of divorce. A man simply had to hand his wife a piece of paper, and he could do so for any reason, including infertility and her failure to please him. But Jesus advances the woman's cause, refusing to allow her to be treated like a piece of property or disposed of at whim. He saw marriage as a sign of God's covenantal love and lifelong fidelity, and exalts it as a sacrament. When both spouses commit themselves to each other and to their vocation, this grace is made manifest, and their bond is strengthened. But sin and human brokenness can interfere with God's plan, leaving separation or even divorce as the only options.

In the longer form of this reading, the people brought their children to Jesus and he blessed them. Maybe we can do the same for those affected by abuse or divorce, so they, at long last, also can be healed.

### YOUTH REFLECTION

### "Like a Child, Accept the Reign of God"

### This Week...

Man and woman are made for each other as perfect partners; when they marry they become one flesh. Their children are a gift and an example for us to follow, for they show us the way to the Reign of God. The human condition, with its two sexes that join physically in the creation of children, is a wonderful condition. Jesus was not ashamed to join us in this wonderful, human condition, and we are honoured and gifted that he did so.

### For Your Reflection

Jesus is enjoying the presence of the children coming to him for hugs and blessings. He makes it clear that we must imitate children and become like them in order to enter the Reign of God.

- Obviously Jesus is calling us to not be childish but to be childlike. How do you see the difference between being childish and being childlike? What exactly are we being called to?
- Not all characteristics of children are good for older people to imitate, but many are. What are some children's habits we should not try to pick up? What are some ways of children that we should try to remember and imitate?
- Do you ever baby-sit younger children? If so, what is your favourite part and your least favourite part of that responsibility? If you have never baby-sat before, what parts do you think you might look forward to, and which parts would you not look forward to?

**RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)** is an incredible journey of discovery, the discovery of God's love in Jesus. If you or someone you know is interested in exploring the friendship and saving grace of Jesus Christ, we invite you to join us in the RCIA journey. It is a warm, welcoming experience that introduces the Christian faith in our Roman Catholic tradition. We explore topics such as Holy Scripture, the Sacraments, Church history and the core beliefs of the Church. Anyone who has taken this "leap of faith" has found it to be a life-altering experience.

The RCIA process is intended for those who are non-baptized. There are several rites and stages that are part of the process to prepare adults for Baptism and to receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil.

**Rite of Reception of Baptized Christians into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church.** If you have been baptized in another Christian tradition, the Catholic Church respects that baptism. Baptism is the sacrament of our rebirth in Christ and our immersion into His saving death and Resurrection. It can never be repeated. Reception into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church happens after a period of preparation through catechesis, prayer and worship, and an introduction to Catholic life, values, and mission.



Adults who have been baptized in the Catholic Church but have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation can prepare for reception of this sacrament through a period of catechesis and prayer.
