# Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada Thank you for your contribution and solidarity!

Following the encouragement of Pope Pius XII, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) was established in 1943 under the name *Canadian Catholic Conference*; it was officially recognized by the Holy See in 1948 and, following the Second Vatican council (1962-1965), became part of the worldwide network of episcopal conferences. As the CCCB President states in his message for the Collection, "Through their Episcopal Conference, the Bishops today continue to work together on doctrinal and ethical questions; ecumenical initiatives and interreligious dialogue; international relations; evangelization, faith education and catechesis; relations with Indigenous peoples; questions of social justice, and the development of a culture of life and family." In addition to their national conference, the Bishops of Canada also meet in four Regional Assemblies (Atlantic, Quebec, Ontario and the West). The CCCB as well as the regional assemblies include the Bishops of the Latin Church in Canada together with the Eparchial Bishops of the Easter Catholic Churches. # We are All Part of the Mission of Christ

One of the great religious scandals is the multiplication of Christian denominations. Fueled partly by arguments about structure, Scripture, theology, and emphasis on individual autonomy ("I don't like what you're doing, so I'll start my own church"), the number has risen over the last few centuries into the hundreds. We can be certain this isn't what Jesus intended. His frequent prayer was "that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you" (John 17:21). But Jesus knew the human temptation to exclude those whom we do not like or understand. The call for oneness can be distorted into the call for exclusiveness, with a select few deciding who's in and who's out, depending on criteria they alone decide.

In today's Gospel, Jesus reminds the disciples that they are not the sole recipients of spiritual gifts or divine grace. Perhaps remembering the account in Numbers, Jesus gently points out that those who preach, heal, or cast out demons in his name are not doing wrong simply because they are not part of the twelve. They, too, can be part of Christ's mission. Jesus reminds them (and us) of the catholic (universal) nature of the body of Christ. I think this prepared them for the spread of Christianity.

As Catholics, we're diverse. Unique. We're also united to many Christians through our common, Trinitarian baptism. And so we pray for the day that all people will be one in the fullness of Christ's power and truth.

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"Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his reward." Mark 9:41

Does your life reflect the life of Jesus? Remember, we were made in His image. We tend to forget this. When others see you, do they see the face of Jesus? When you look at others, do you see the face of Jesus in them?

# "A Cup of Water in Jesus' Name"

## This Week...

Both Joshua and John have the same concerns. Both Moses and Jesus have the same response. Don't be so worried! Don't be such an elitist! Anyone can serve. If good work is being done, please don't stop it. Let it happen; in fact encourage it.

Ames reminds us that the good work we don't do can hurt us. If others suffer from our lack of service, we will be held accountable for it.

### For Your Reflection

In both the first reading and the Gospel, the same situation occurs. Joshua and John are concerned because an outsider is doing the kinds of things they are supposed to be doing. Moses and Jesus reassure them: There is nothing to worry about. The more, the merrier. Do not be jealous or insecure.

- When have you been jealous of someone else? When has someone's actions, talents, accomplishments, or friendships worried you? When have you begun to feel concerned that someone else's success might make your success less important or impressive?
- When has someone shut you out of their circle of friends? What was it like? How did you deal with it?
- Have you ever tried to shut someone out of your circle of friends? Why? What was the problem? What happened?

Jesus says that whenever we give someone even just a cup of water in his name, we will have our reward.

- What do you think it means to give something or to do something "in Jesus' name"?
- Have you had the opportunity to serve Jesus in that way but chose to put it off, or decided to do otherwise? What influenced your decision?
- Do you think most teenagers would see serving Jesus as a worthy goal or priority? Why or why not? If not, what do you think of that opinion? How is serving Jesus any different from making the world a better place?



**RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)** is an incredible journey of discovery, the discovery of God's love in Jesus. If you or someone you know is interested in exploring the friendship and saving grace of Jesus Christ, we invite you to join us in the RCIA journey. It is a warm, welcoming experience that introduces the Christian faith in our Roman Catholic tradition. We explore topics such as Holy Scripture, the Sacraments, Church history and the core beliefs of the Church. Anyone who has taken this "leap of faith" has found it to be a life-altering experience.

The RCIA process is intended for those who are non-baptized. There are several rites and stages that are part of the process to prepare adults for Baptism and to receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil.

**Rite of Reception of Baptized Christians into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church.** If you have been baptized in another Christian tradition, the Catholic Church respects that baptism. Baptism is the sacrament of our rebirth in Christ and our immersion into His saving death and Resurrection. It can never be repeated. Reception into the Full Communion of the Catholic Church happens after a period of preparation through catechesis, prayer and worship, and an introduction to Catholic life, values, and mission.



Adults who have been baptized in the Catholic Church but have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation can prepare for reception of this sacrament through a period of catechesis and prayer.
